Mr. Partamian has also written YES, WE HAVE and YES, WE HAVE TOO. These volumes comprise documentation of contributions of Armenian-Americans to the United States of America.

and their contributions. **Chanteur Charles** Aznavour recently commented at an event honoring him that if the genocide had not occurred, he would probably be singing in Turkish. The same could be said for all those Armenian-American contributors. As President Obama said on April 23, 2011, "The legacy of the Armenian people is one of resiliency, determination, and triumph over those who sought to destroy them. The United States has deeply benefited from the significant contributions to our nation by Armenian-Americans, many of whom are descended from the survivors of the Medz Yeghern. "

Speaking of which, the 102nd anniversary of the

Armenian Genocide will take place on Monday, April 24, at 6:30 p.m., at Fresno State at the Genocide Memorial, located on the Maple Mall. Local clergy will conduct a short service and the guest speaker will be Fresno Mayor Lee Brand. FSU President Dr. Joseph Castro and the Honorable Consul to Armenia of Fresno Berj Apkarian will also be present. The public is invited to bring flowers to lay around the eternity symbol within the monument. A reception will follow.

The final event to commemorate the Armenian Genocide for 2017 will be the premiere screening of the long-awaited documentary film by Bared Maronian, *The Women of 1915* on Sunday, April 30, at 1:00 p.m. at Fresno State's Leon and Pete Peters Educational Auditorium. Mr. Maronian also made the documentary *Orphans of the Genocide*, which had a fundraising screening here several years ago at our local PBS station. These documentaries are not-for-

Armenian Cultural Conservancy Logo The six- and eightpointed stars have a long history in pre-Christian Armenia and have been adopted in Church architecture and decorative arts. They are thought to have magical powers and are used extensively in astronomy and sacred art. The logo's wheel of eternity signifies life; the eight-pointed star represents the eight architectural pillars of the Armenian Church; the color purple represents the commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the Genocide; the gold color is the richness of the Armenian culture.
