Approximately 50 residents and community members attended and enjoyed the popcorn, snacks and drinks provided by Conservancy supporters. It was a thought-provoking, entertaining movie on the topic of one's legacy after passing.

Sunset Soirée Highlights Prospect of a Permanent Home for the Armenian Cultural Conservancy

With eyes set toward the future, community members gathered for an autumn soirée on Saturday, September 28 in the East Courtyard at The Vineyards. The Armenian Cultural Conservancy (ACC) hosted their annual benefit on the newly expanded grounds of the California Armenian Home (CAH).

This charitable giving event demonstrated the valued partnership between ACC and CAH, and provided supporters of both institutions the opportunity to learn about enriching the future while celebrating a shared past and present. CAH generously partnered with ACC in Spring 2019. Board President Lucy Kazanjian Grayson offered an office space on the grounds allowing for display cabinets of collectibles (donated or on loan) to share with residents and visitors to The Vineyards.

Local artist Pat Hunter was commissioned by ACC Co-Chair Midge Barrett to bring to life a painting of the 1894 Henry Vartanian House. Through her signature watercolor, she depicted the house as envisioned in Fresno's historic district of Armenian Town. Especially for the event, Mary Ekmalian, Van Der Mugrdechian, and Megan Jendian displayed heirlooms and prepared photographic displays of historical and informational materials. Armenian Cultural Conservancy Logo

The six- and eightpointed stars have a long history in pre-Christian Armenia and have been adopted in Church architecture and decorative arts. They are thought to have magical powers and are used extensively in astronomy and sacred art. The logo's wheel of eternity signifies life; the eight-pointed star represents the eight architectural pillars of the Armenian Church; the color purple represents the commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the Genocide; the gold color is the richness of the Armenian culture.

tique books from Zaroohi Der Mugrdechian, wooden bath slippers from Nelsene Deranrian, and a carpet from Frances Tusan (*see photo*).

During the wine reception surrounded by palm trees and a water fountain, guests enjoyed music provided by pianist David Aus. A delicious, bountiful mezze was prepared by the Holy Trinity Ladies' Guild Catering headed by Mary Ekmalian, Jane Knar Lanas, and Patty Torosian, and The Vineyards Executive Chef Brian Kesanen created many other tasty, attractive appetizers.

A welcoming address was delivered from the evening's organizing chair, Mary Ekmalian, who thanked all supporters of ACC's mission to "collect, preserve, and interpret the evidence of the Armenian experience in Central California in an enduring institution of learning." Members of Heritage Fresno were also recognized for giving impetus to the formation of ACC, including historian Mabelle Selland, Charles and Midge Barrett, Pat Hunter, Janice Stevens, Mr. and Mrs. Herb Arden, and Gary Becker.

ACC Co-Chair Charles Barrett mentioned the rationale of Pat Hunter's comment regarding the printed placemats, that "sometimes art can influence people" and stressed the urgency of moving forward as an action-committee to quickly

relocate the Vartanian House. This historic house is likely the oldest remaining in Fresno and has already been saved once by the Caglia family and donated to the Fresno Rescue Mission. Although the buildings were restored, the property on which it sits is now needed for another purpose. Once again, the Vartanian House needs to be salvaged. Now is the time to move it – most appropriately to Armenian Town – and can be re-purposed as the Armenian Cultural Conservancy.

The evening's brief program featured an update from Residential Director George Juarez. With over four decades of experience and service at the Home, George relayed heart-warming and personal anecdotes representative of the residents' strength, loyalty, and dedication to history. "This Vartanian project will materialize. When Armenians believe in something, they make it happen."

Emcee Sarah Soghomonian, a producer with first-hand experience of local history documentaries, emphasized the relevance of being connected with our collective and cultural past. With an appreciation of rare architecture, she displayed enthusiasm for the prospect of the Vartanian House being relocated and re-purposed, and encouraged a philanthropic spirit among the attendees.


